VILLAGE OF DEXTER ZONING CODE & NYS BUILDING & FIRE CODES

Under the above codes you may be required to have a building permit for construction, demolition, furnace or wood stove installation, plumbing alteration or electrical updates, roof replacements, & installation of pools or fencing within the boundaries of the Village of Dexter. This is a partial list of what may require permits. New York State has revised code requirements for many building permits including roofing. If you are considering improvements to your property, it is recommended you contact Mr. Millington to see if a building permit is required. Building permit applications can be mailed or picked up at the village office. The Zoning and Subdivision Law are on the Village Website under "Quick Links". Also, a "Resident's Toolbox" is available just above the Zoning Law. The "Toolbox" was written by Jean Simoneau, a former Chairman of the Planning Board, to make understanding the Zoning Laws easier.

Head Start is a pre-school setting for 3 and 4-year-old children. There is a home-based program available for rural areas. Transportation is available within boundaries. Healthy meals and snacks are provided. Field trips are offered. There is an inclusive setting for special needs children and family support services are available. Hearing, vision and developmental screenings are offered for all children. Bilingual services are available. There is no cost and it is within the General Brown School District. Head Start is sponsored by the Community Action Planning Council of Jefferson County.

AMBULANCE SERVICES...315-788-8105

The Town of Brownville, with cooperation from the Villages of Dexter, Brownville and Glen Park, contracted with Guilfoyle Ambulance Service, Inc. to provide ambulance service on a 24/7 basis to the Town of Brownville and the Villages of Dexter, Brownville, and Glen Park. **Guilfoyle will bill your private insurance carrier, Medicare or Medicaid for their services. You will be required to provide Guilfoyle personnel with your insurance information when requested.** Please Note: The contract does not include routine non-emergency transfers to and from the home, hospitals or doctor's offices. If you need an ambulance, please **call 911** and the Guilfoyle ambulance will be dispatched to your residence.

DISABLED PERSONS PERMIT

Plastic hanging permits are available for Village residents at the Village Office. To obtain a permit you need an application certified by a physician, or a dated certification letter from your physician on official stationary stating a permanent or temporary disability. If you have a driver's license, a copy is required at the time the handicapped hanger is issued. A copy can be made at the Village Office.

VILLAGE SQUARE PUBLIC SIGN

PARKING

Whether there is snow or not the parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited on all highways or between the sidewalk & the street within the village of dexter between 2:00 am and 6:00 am November 1st to April 1st. Violators will be ticketed, towed or both.

Basketball hoops or any other obstructions within the Village Right of Way need to be removed. The Village will not be responsible for any incidents and or damages that may occur from such obstructions.

Public parking at a local business must not interfere with emergency vehicles. Fire, rescue and ambulance vehicles must have a clear path to and from the Municipal Building at all times. There is no parking allowed on East Kirby St. across from the Laundromat in signed areas. Violators will have the appropriate action taken.

Storage of abandoned, unused, or unlicensed motor vehicles upon private land within the village, unless wholly contained in a garage or other structure is prohibited. A 30-day permit can be obtained in the Village Office. **Violators can be issued a fine of up to \$250.**

The goal of the Dexter Historical Society is to make the rich and interesting history of the Dexter area, including Limerick & Pillar Point, readily available to all residents of and visitors to our community. To this end, the Society presents a series of programs and events each year and maintains the Dexter Area Museum, 105 East Kirby Street. It is our goal to open the Museum to the public at regular times each week. To make this possible, we must first complete the sorting & detailed cataloging of the Society's holdings, a task which will require significant time and effort from a team of volunteers. We invite anyone interested in assisting with this task to join with us in our efforts to provide regular public access to the Museum.

The Museum building is now 180 years old. The exterior of the building has been scraped and repainted, the steeple has been repaired, and the bell which previously hung has been removed and mounted on a pedestal beside the Museum, with a big help from our fellow Village DPW. Interior maintenance still needs to be done; and pressure washing will be done to the exterior to remove grime and insects. Plans are being drawn up for The Last Station, a building to be constructed next to the Museum, which will house two old pumpers and other apparatus from the Dexter Volunteer Fire Department. Construction will begin on this building soon. We thank you for your patience during the COVID-19 pandemic, the food pantry will allow you to choose your own food items again, with some restrictions listed below.

- 1.) You will still remain in your vehicle at first until it is your turn. We will get your information and give you a number.
- 2.) The Town of Brownville Food Pantry is open to all qualifying residents in the Town of Brownville to include the Villages of Dexter, Brownville, and Glen Park. You will need to fill out and sign a short form, show a photo ID, along with two proofs of current residence showing your actual physical address such as a National Grid Statement {not PO box or an envelope}. All information provided is confidential and kept in locked files.
- 3.) Only one person per family will be allowed in the pantry. If you need extra assistance, the assistant will also need to abide by the rules.

The food pantry provides a five-day supply of food and you may choose your items. A volunteer will provide you with the quantity you will receive in regard to your family size. Residents from the Town of Brownville may visit the food pantry once a month. We do not make deliveries to your home.

Please no open or partially used products. New York State allows us to give out food items that are no more than one-year past expiration date. Volunteers check every item donated for expiration dates, please do not bring items that cannot be of use to us.

The Town of Brownville Food Pantry wants to thank everyone who has generously made donations to the food pantry, especially during this Covid-19 virus. Our pantry appreciates your support, kindness and thoughtfulness towards others in our communities. We are able to keep our food pantry open because of caring people like you. We also thank all of our 35 volunteers who help run the pantry. They come from the three villages within the Town of Brownville, Watertown, and Town of Hounsfield. They include young and older men, women, students from the General Brown School District, Boy Scouts, and Cub Scouts. The pantry couldn't function without their help and dedication.

LOCAL LAW #4 OF 4-2017 DOG CONTROL

According to Village of Dexter Local Law #4 of 2017, dogs are not permitted to run at large, deposit waste on public or private property, bark, howl, or whine continually, within the Village of Dexter. Violation of this law is punishable by a fine of \$25.00 or more. Any dog, running loose without a collar or tag will be considered unlicensed or any dog creating a nuisance will be picked up by the Dog Control Officer. Should you encounter a problem with a stray dog or a bothersome dog, please call the Dog Control Officer **Betsy Ring 315-836-5312.**

VILLAGE OF DEXTER PRIOR NOTICE LAW

No civil actions shall be maintained against the Village of Dexter for damages or injuries to persons or property sustained by reason of any highway, bridge, sidewalk, or culvert being defective, out of repair, unsafe, dangerous or obstructed unless: written notice of such a condition was received by the clerk of the village, and there was a failure-neglect within a reasonable time after the giving of such notice to repair or correct the defect.

Village Law §6-602; Highway Law §319

This is a friendly reminder that the Village of Dexter Department of Public Works/Highway Department has no liability in replacing or repairing mailboxes or other fixtures that are placed in the village's right-of-way. During the course of roadway maintenance and snowplowing, such items may be unintentionally damaged. We regret that this may happen from time to time, but our road safety and maintenance is priority and of the upmost importance. Property owners have no right to interfere with a speedy and efficient removal of snow by placing the mailbox in such a position as to cause interference. There is no statutory law or legal authority which grants a property owner or resident along a public highway or street the right to place a mailbox in a highway right-of-way. Please see Village Law §6-602; Highway Law §319, which can be found online.

The Village of Dexter's Sewer Code {Article VI § 232-25} states the following: "No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any storm water, surface water, groundwater, roof run-off, sub-surface drainage, cooling water, or industrial process water to the public sewer." This code includes sump pumps. It is illegal to discharge water from the sump pumps into the sanitary sewers. Sump pumps must discharge into the storm sewer or out into the yard. Per Village of Dexter Code §310-15: Damage to Water Meters

"Any damage which any meter may sustain by reason of the carelessness of the owner, his agent or tenant of the premises or from neglect of any of them to properly protect the same, including any damage or injury that may result from allowing said meter to become frozen or otherwise injured, shall be paid to the Village of Dexter by the owner of the property served by such meter."

TRASH REMOVAL

PICK N GO PROPERTY WASTE SERVICES

Weekly Service, Thursdays, beginning at 7am

All recyclables and trash must be curbside by 7am in order to be picked up.

- Refuse is limited to six 33-gallon trash bags weighing no more than 40 lbs. each.
- All recyclables must be rinsed and cleaned. Recyclables can be placed together in one container or one CLEAR plastic bag.
- All cardboard must be broken down/flattened, tied and separated from all other trash and recyclables.
- Electronics, including televisions, will NOT be picked up on weekly trash days or during the Spring & Fall Cleanup Days. See notice below to dispose of electronics.
- Please place trash bags in trash cans with covers.

Recyclables cannot be mixed with garbage. Landfills are strictly enforcing the Jefferson County Recycling Law. The landfill will not accept and will issue fines to the Village for cardboard mixed with garbage.

PUBLIC NOTICES:

WATER & SEWER BILLING Beginning the April 1st through June 30th quarterly billing 2022, (reflected on the July bill), there will be a minimum quarterly bill for any water and or sewer account that is shut off. During the period which an account is inactive there will be no charge for water, sewer or refuse usage. However, the resident will still be responsible to pay their portion of the quarterly DANC and Water Debt \$63.00 and or Sewer Debt \$46.00 as do all active accounts in their regular quarterly water bill. (Anyone tied into the water and or sewer system is responsible for paying their portion of the water/sewer debt for the infrastructure).

SEWER INCREASE Beginning the April 1st through June 30th quarterly billing 2022, (reflected on the July bill), there will be a sewer rate increase of \$10.00 per quarter to sustain the sewer debt payment.

SEWER DISCHARGES

To the residents of the Village of Dexter,

In 2016 the Village of Dexter underwent a multimillion-dollar sewer system upgrade. At that time Village residents were notified to have any and all discharge water that was being sent to the public sewer system rectified.

Per Village Code *Article VI Use of Public Sewers, 232-25. Drainage discharges.* It states “No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any stormwater, surface water, groundwater, roof runoff, subsurface drainage, cooling water, or industrial process waters to the public sewer”.

The Village is requesting inspections of the storm drainage discharges on all Village properties. The Village will begin enforcing removal of all “illegal” connections to the sanitary sewer system. The Dexter Code provides penalties at \$250 per day for the failure to comply with a notice to disconnect an illegal connection within 30 days. The Village expects there will be a high rate of voluntary compliance with this inspection program as the goal is to reduce sewer treatment plant costs, in turn keeping sewer rate increases to a minimum.

All residents are being asked to please call the Village Office to set up an appointment for an inspection with James Millington, Village of Dexter Code Enforcement. After being inspected documentation will be provided to the homeowner as well as being filed with the clerk in said residents file. Thank you for your time in the matter.

WATER BILLS are mailed quarterly on or before **January 10th, April 10th, July 10th and October 10th.** It is your responsibility to know when your bill is due, if you do not receive your water billing by the 16th of the month they are mailed out, please call the Village Office at 315-639-6260 for information on your billing. Please keep our office updated with current contact information and any address changes. **If the water, sewer, and refuse billing is not paid within the allotted 60-day period and service is shut off, a restoration fee of \$50.00 will be charged and added to the amount due. The restoration fee for turn on afterhours, weekends, and holidays is \$100.00. The full amount due must be paid before services will be reinstated.**

I remember pulling burdocks off of him for hours... when going to bed that night I wanted him to come inside but this poor guy was covered with fleas and ticks. So happy to my eyes when I opened the door the next morning, he was right there waiting for me. We went for a long walk and on our way back he was running so fast through the woods that I hoped he wasn't going back to where he came from. Nope... He was right there waiting for me. While packing up our stuff to go home I looked at him and said I can't go home without you. Never so brave in my life I went over and asked the owner if I could bring him home, she gratefully handed me his bandana and collar and a book about Border Collies and told me his date of birth. I thanked her and promised I would bring him to a good home and love him. I was so happy that he would never be mistreated again.

On our way home: I said to myself what the heck did I just do. Well what WE did was rescued each other. I had lost my Mom two months before this boy named Bones came into my life and I truly believe she sent him to me. He came from the little town of Dexter and that is what we decided to name him. One day I walked into a pet store and saw a calendar of a border collie playing agility and said I want to do that with my dog. I immediately googled agility training. We had a private lesson 3 days later and started training 2 days later and after 7 months we attended our first AKC show where Dexter came in 1st place 7/8 runs and earned his Novice Jumpers title (NAJ) and several after that: NA NAJ NF OA OAJ OF AX AXJ XF MX MXB MXS MXG MXC MXJ MJB MJS MJG MJC MJB2 MJS2 MXP MJP MXP2 MJP2 MXP3 MJP3 MJP4 MXPB MJPB.

He earned 3 Master Agility Championship titles and 1 Preferred Agility Championship title and his PAX. We attended the 2014 National Agility Championship show. He loved the jumps the most...flying high in the sky. I have always been so honored to walk into and out of the ring with him. I never realized how much confidence a dog could give a human. We have traveled many miles together but the most important "things" we have done on our agility journey is built a bond and trust for one another. I love and respect my Dexter boy more than I could ever put into words. I am so very proud of all of his achievements. He was a wonderful partner. We made so many wonderful friends while playing agility and camping 🐾🐾 he has brought so many people into my life whether in our neighborhood or at the park. He went everywhere with us, everyone loved him and he loved everyone.

He walked me down the wedding aisle with my Dad carrying our wedding rings. He kept my husband and I together through the years as we both loved him and he wanted to be with both of us. I have been so fortunate to be able to work from home the last 19 months to take care of him and watch my sweet boy grow old gracefully. He was the best co- worker and I miss him checking in on me and putting his sweet face on my lap. He was such a gift and I am so truly fortunate to have him in my life. I wish he was here licking the tears off my face like he always did. I love you my Sweet Dexter boy 🐾❤️
