This is a partial list of what may require permits. New York State has revised code requirements for many building permits including roofing. If you are considering improvements to your property, it is recommended you contact Mr. Millington to see if a building permit is required. The Town of Brownville, with cooperation from the Villages of Dexter, Brownville and Glen Park, have contracted with Guilfoyle Ambulance Service, Inc. to provide ambulance service on a 24/7 basis to the Town of Brownville and the Villages of Dexter, Brownville, and Glen Park. Guilfoyle will bill your private insurance carrier, Medicare or Medicaid for their services. You will be required to provide Guilfoyle personnel with your insurance information when requested. The contract does not include routine nonemergency transfers to and from the home, hospitals or doctor's offices. If you need an ambulance, please call 911 and the Guilfoyle ambulance will be dispatched to your residence.

DISABLED PERSONS PERMIT

Plastic hanging permits are available for Village residents at the Village Office. To obtain a permit you need an application certified by a physician, or a dated certification letter from your physician on official stationery stating a permanent or temporary disability. If you have a driver's license, a copy is required at the time the handicapped hanger is issued. A copy can be made at the Village Office.

PARKING

Whether there is snow or not the parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited on all highways or between the sidewalk & the street within the village of dexter between 2:00 am and 6:00 am November 1st to April 1st. Violators will be ticketed, towed or both.

Public parking at a local business must not interfere with emergency vehicles. Fire, rescue and ambulance vehicles must have a clear path to and from the Municipal Building at all times. There is no parking allowed on East Kirby St. across from the Laundromat in signed areas. Violators will have the appropriate action taken.

Storage of abandoned, unused, or unlicensed motor vehicles upon private land within the village, unless wholly contained in a garage or other structure is prohibited. A 30-day permit can be obtained in the Village Office. Violators can be issued a fine of up to \$250.

Basketball hoops or any other obstructions within the Village Right of Way need to be removed. The Village will not be responsible for any incidents and or damages that may occur from such obstructions.

To make this possible, we must first complete the sorting & detailed cataloging of the Society's holdings, a task which will require significant time and effort from a team of volunteers. The Museum building is now over 180 years old. The exterior of the building has been scraped and repainted, the steeple has been repaired, and the bell which previously hung has been removed and mounted on a pedestal beside the Museum, with a big help from our fellow Village DPW. Interior maintenance still needs to be done; and pressure washing will be done to the exterior to remove grime and insects.

All are welcome to attend the meetings to learn more about the Society's work & programs. THE LAST STATION CAMPAIGN DEXTER VOL. FD, INC. & DEXTER HISTORICAL SOCIETY, As of March 27, 2024

Thanks to many volunteers, the heating system provided by the Northern New York Community Foundation (NNYCF), and The Last Station Committee deciding to insulate the new building with a couple inches of spray foam, we have been able to work on the inside of the building during the winter months.

this task to join with us in our efforts to provide regular public access to the Museum.

The historical society's second floor storage area is complete, electrical installation is roughed in & complete in areas, fiberglass insulation on top of the spray foam is installed, the breezeway is about ready to paint, and the ceiling is being installed. It is safe to say that about 80% of the interior work is done. With the help of the Village of Dexter, Town of Brownville, and a break in the weather we were able to upgrade the sewer and water connection to the museum and install a connection to the new building.



Since the inception of the project in 2019 we have experienced a 20%+ cost increase for materials. We have also included several items in the project that complement the existing museum building to make it an integral part of the Dexter Historical Society Campus, provide much needed storage space for the historical society and to ensure The Last Station will last well into the future to perpetuate the history of the Dexter Volunteer Fire Department. Yes, the costs have exceeded our 2019 estimate.

Personal donations, donations in memory of people that have passed on, business donations, fund raising activities by the two organizations, the grant from the NNYCF, volunteer time and village & town equipment, work force and material have allowed us to get the project to where it is today, but we need a little more to get us over the hump to complete the project. At recent meetings of the fire department and historical society the memberships have agreed to commit to helping the project to get over this hump to completion. But please remember that both organizations have their own budget constraints, and we will need help covering utility, insurance and maintenance costs going into the



future. Please consider contributing to The Last Station Funding Drive to not only help us move forward, but also to be recognized in the new building for doing so.

To date we have about half of the spaces on the fire department memorial cross filled. Plaques for the Maltese Memorial Cross honoring firefighters and auxiliary members that have answered their last call are still available. The final resting place for the memorial cross will be at The Last Station and will become an important part of the department's history. The plaques for the cross can be purchased by family and friends of those who served the Dexter Fire Department. ACCESSIBILITY

Another very significant part of the project is the addition of facilities which will make both The Last Station and the Dexter Area Museum accessible for the handicapped and for those who are not so young anymore. A lift is being installed which will run between The Last Station, at ground level, and the Museum, which is over half a story higher, making the Museum fully accessible. The restroom facilities will be handicapped accessible also (which those in the Museum most definitely are not).

When we began this project, cost estimates were at around \$100,000. We set this as our initial goal. Since that time, estimates have risen to at least \$125,000. The reasons for this, which include supply chain issues and the current state of our economy, are all too familiar to To date, we have raised most. approximately \$90,000 - certainly encouraging, but the completion of the project will require even more generosity from the people of our community. Please help us to finish this great project and, through it, to honor those who give and have given selflessly to ensure our safety and well-being.

THE LAST STATION FUNDING DRIVE

The Dexter Volunteer Fire Department is turning to the residents of the Dexter area for help with a very significant project. Partnering with the Dexter Historical Society, we are adding a new building to the Society's Museum, to be known as The Last Station. The building will house two historic pumpers owned by the DVFD and related exhibits, as well as storage space, which the Society badly needs.

The facility will increase public awareness of a most important part of our villlage's history. Perhaps more significantly, it will honor our firefighters and the selfless service they have provided to our community for over a century and a half. The building and its exhibits will be unique in the region and possibly in all of Upstate New York. They are certain to draw many visitors to our village.

This Drive is separate from the Historical Society's Capital Campaign, If you have given to that campaign, we thank you very much. We certainly do not expect you ro give to this drive, also (but we would not discourage it, either).

GIVING CATEGORIES


Through this funding drive, the Dexter Volunteer Fire Department hopes to raise the funds still needed to complete The Last Station. Any contribution is very much appreciated, of course. However, we are hoping for a number of substantial donations, given the importance of this project. We are establishing three categories of giving, with donors to be listed on three appropriate Last Station donor plaques, each in the form of a fire hydrant. (These will be separate from the Historical Society's Capital Campaign plaque, listing only donors to this drive.)

The three categories, with donation ranges, are:

GOLD HYDRANT: \$500+ SILVER HYDRANT: \$250-\$499 BRONZE HYDRANT: \$100-\$249

There will also be a Major Donors plaque, a Chief's Helmet, where the names of those donating \$1000 or more will be listed. This list will include anyone whose combined donations to the Funding Drive, the Capital Campaign, and any other fund-raising efforts total \$1000 or more.

(It would be possible, then, for a donor to be listed on the Historical Society's Capital Campaign plaque, on one of the Hydrants, and on the Chief's Helmet. We encourage our supporters to consider this possibility.)

- 1.) You will still remain in your vehicle until it is your turn. We will get your information and give you a number.
- 2.) The Town of Brownville Food Pantry is open to all qualifying residents in the Town of Brownville to include the Villages of Dexter, Brownville, and Glen Park. You will need to fill out and sign a short form, show a photo ID, along with two proofs of current residence showing your actual physical address such as a National Grid Statement {not PO box or an envelope}. All information provided is confidential and kept in locked files.
- 3.) Only one person per family will be allowed in the pantry. If you need extra assistance, the assistant will also need to abide by the rules.

The food pantry provides a five-day supply of food and you may choose your items. A volunteer will provide you with the quantity you will receive in regard to your family size. Residents from the Town of Brownville may visit the food pantry once a month. We do not make deliveries to your home.

Drop off boxes located at the Dexter & Brownville Post Offices, the Brownville & Glen Park Village Offices, and the United Methodist Church in Dexter. Please be sure to notify one of our contacts prior to dropping off any donations to the United Methodist Church to ensure that someone will be there. For monetary donations checks may be made payable to the Dexter United Methodist Church Food Pantry mailed to PO Box 642, Dexter, New York 13634. Please no open or partially used products. New York State allows us to give out food items that are no more than one-year past expiration date. Volunteers check every item donated for expiration dates, please do not bring items that cannot be of use to us.

The Town of Brownville Food Pantry wants to thank everyone who continues to make donations to the food pantry. Our pantry appreciates your support, kindness and thoughtfulness towards others in our communities. We are able to keep our food pantry open because of caring people like you as well as our 35 volunteers who help run the pantry. Volunteers come from the three villages within the Town of Brownville, Watertown, and Town of Hounsfield. They include young and older men, women, students from the General Brown School District, Boy Scouts, and Cub Scouts. The pantry couldn't function without their help and dedication.

LOCAL LAW #4 OF 4-2017 DOG CONTROL

According to Village of Dexter Local Law #4 of 2017, dogs are not permitted to run at large, deposit waste on public or private property, bark, howl, or whine continually, within the Village of Dexter. Violation of this law is punishable by a fine of \$25.00 or more, Any dog, running loose without a collar or tag will be considered unlicensed or any dog creating a nuisance will be picked up by the Dog Control Officer. Should you encounter a problem with a stray dog or a bothersome dog, please call the Dog Control Officer Betsy Ring 315-836-5312.

DOG LICENSE

To obtain a dog license, residents of the village can go to the Town of Brownville office, located at 16431 Star School Road, Dexter, Phone-315-639-6266.

VILLAGE OF DEXTER PRIOR NOTICE LAW

No civil actions shall be maintained against the Village of Dexter for damages or injuries to persons or property sustained by reason of any highway, bridge, sidewalk, or culvert being defective, out of repair, unsafe, dangerous or obstructed unless: written notice of such a condition was received by the clerk of the village, and there was a failure or neglect within a reasonable time after the giving of such notice to repair or correct the defect.

Village Law §6-602; Highway Law §319

This is a friendly reminder that the Village of Dexter Department of Public Works/Highway Department has no liability in replacing or repairing mailboxes or other fixtures that are placed in the village's right-of-way. During the course of roadway maintenance and snowplowing, such items may be unintentionally damaged. We regret that this may happen from time to time, but our road safety and maintenance is priority and of the upmost importance. Property owners have no right to interfere with a speedy and efficient removal of snow by placing the mailbox in such a position as to cause interference. There is no statutory law or legal authority which grants a property owner or resident along a public highway or street the right to place a mailbox in a highway right-of-way. Please see Village Law §6-602; Highway Law §319, which can be found online.

The Village of Dexter's Sewer Code {Article VI § 232-25} states the following: "No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any storm water, surface water, groundwater, roof run-off, sub-surface drainage, cooling water, or industrial process water to the public sewer." This code includes sump pumps. It is illegal to discharge water from sump pumps into the sanitary sewers. Sump pumps must discharge into the storm sewer or out into the yard. For questions, please call the Village Office at 315-639-6260 or the DPW at 315-639-4200.

Per Village of Dexter Code §310-15: Damage to Water Meters

"Any damage which any meter may sustain by reason of the carelessness of the owner, his agent or tenant of the premises or from neglect of any of them to properly protect the same, including any damage or injury that may result from allowing said meter to become frozen or otherwise injured, shall be paid to the Village of Dexter by the owner of the property served by such meter."

WATER FILLING STATION

The Village of Dexter has a water filling station Located next to the DPW building at 223 lakeview drive.

SEWER DISCHARGES

To the residents of the Village of Dexter,

In 2016 the Village of Dexter underwent a multimillion-dollar sewer system upgrade. At that time Village residents were notified to have any and all discharge water that was being sent to the public sewer system rectified.

Per Village Code *Article VI Use of Public Sewers*, 232-25. *Drainage discharges*. It states, "No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any stormwater, surface water, groundwater, roof runoff, subsurface drainage, cooling water, or industrial process waters to the public sewer".

The Village is requesting inspections of the storm drainage discharges on all Village properties. The Village will begin enforcing removal of all "illegal" connections to the sanitary sewer system. The Dexter Code provides penalties at \$250 per day for the failure to comply with a notice to disconnect an illegal connection within 30 days. The Village expects there will be a high rate of voluntary compliance with this inspection program as the goal is to reduce sewer treatment plant costs, in turn keeping sewer rate increases to a minimum.

All residents are being asked to please call the Village Office to set up an appointment for an inspection with James Millington, Village of Dexter Code Enforcement. After being inspected documentation will be provided to the homeowner as well as being filed with the clerk in said resident's file. Thank you for your time in the matter.

TRASH REMOVAL

PICK N GO PROPERTY WASTE SERVICES

Weekly Service, Thursdays, beginning at 7am

All recyclables and trash must be curbside by 7am in order to be picked up.

- Refuse is limited to six 33-gallon trash bags weighing no more than 40 lbs. each.
- All recyclables must be rinsed and cleaned. Recyclables can be placed together in one container or one CLEAR plastic bag.
- All cardboard must be broken down/flattened, tied and separated from all other trash and recyclables.
- Electronics, including televisions, will NOT be picked up on weekly trash days or during the Spring & Fall Cleanup Days. See notice below to dispose of electronics. -Please place trash bags in trash cans with covers.

Recyclables cannot be mixed with garbage. Landfills are strictly enforcing the Jefferson County Recycling Law. The landfill will not accept and will issue fines to the Village for cardboard mixed with garbage.



If the above rules are not followed the trash will not be picked up.

When residents or contractors cut down trees within the Village of Dexter, they are responsible for taking away any and all wood and brush. The Village DPW will pick up limbs once during the week of spring and fall clean up and after severe storm damage. All other brush and trimmings throughout the year will need to be taken to the Town of Brownville Transfer Site or the Jefferson County Transfer Site. Brush and limbs need to be removed from the side of the road within 14 days.

For Village residents the Town of Brownville Transfer Site will accept electronics, to include computers, printers, monitors, televisions, microwaves and rechargeable batteries along with green material-leaves, lawn clippings and branches up to 4" diameter and 4' lengths. If you are a <u>resident of the Village of Dexter</u>, a permit for the transfer site can be picked up at the Village Office during normal office hours, there is no permit fee.

DON'T GET SCAMMED

Phone, text and email scams are on the rise and scammers are becoming more and more sophisticated in their tactics. They may call you claiming to be a family member in legal trouble needing bail money. They might claim your accounts are in danger of being closed, utilities will be shut off or threaten you or your family with legal action. Scammers rely on creating a sense of urgency to get you to act without thinking. These high-pressure tactics are red flags of a scam.

- Don't rely on caller ID-scammers can make it seem that they are calling from a legitimate business
- If you are suspicious of a call, text or email, contact the business through their published phone number
- Never give sensitive information- PINs, account numbers, social security number, etc.
- Never click on an unsolicited link sent via text message- especially if it asks you to sign in to your bank account
- Be skeptical of every email-often, the scammer will disguise the email to look and sound like it's from your bank or other legitimate business.
- If they tell you that you have to pay a bill using gift cards-IT IS A SCAM!

What to do if you fall for a scam

- 1. If you gave a scammer personal information like your SSN or bank account number, go to IdentityTheft.gov or call (877) 438-4338 to see what steps to take, including how to monitor your credit.
- 2. Change your password if you shared any sort of username or password.
- 3. Contact your bank and/or credit card company.
- 4. If you lost money, file a police report by calling 315-786-2601.
- 5. Report the scam to the Federal Trade Commission or call 1-877-FTC-HELP (382-4357).

The operation of Utility Terrain Vehicles is not permitted on Village roadways.

ANNUAL BURN BAN

The annual state ban on outdoor burning begins on March 16 and extends through May 14. With the winter season this year providing much less snow than normal across Tug Hill, the wildfire danger may start earlier than normal, so the NYS Department of Environmental Conservations "advocating extra vigilance before the burn ban goes into effect". Open burning remains the single greatest cause of wildfires in New York.

WATER BILLS

Water bills are **mailed quarterly on or before January 10th, April 10th, July 10th and October 10th.** It is your responsibility to know when your bill is due, if you do not receive your water billing by the 16th of the month they are mailed out, please call the Village Office at 315-639-6260 for information on your billing. Please keep our office updated with current contact information and any address changes. If the water, sewer, and refuse billing is not paid within the allotted 60-day period and service is shut off, a restoration fee of \$50.00 will be charged and added to the amount due. The restoration fee for turn on afterhours, weekends, and holidays is \$100.00. The full amount due must be paid before services will be reinstated.

There is a drop box located next to the side entrance of the Village Office, located at 509 Liberty Street, for your convenience. If you need to leave water payments, tax payments, building permits, or other information after office hours, please use this drop box. Be sure to put all payments in an envelope with your name address or account number included.
